potion!

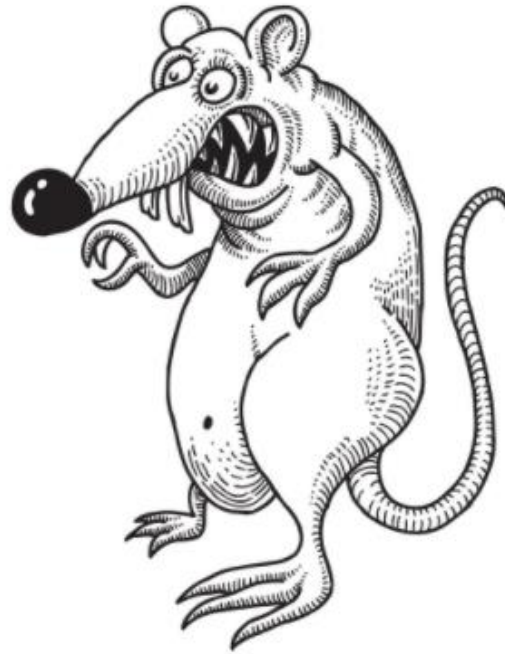
WAGOLL (shorter version!)
