PE/Ear Tape

If your child has pierced ears, we ask that they remove these for PE lessons. If the ears are newly pierced we ask for these to be covered over with microporous tape. If your child requires this, please send it to school in their bag. Thank you.

National Height and Weight Child Measurement Programme – Reception and Year 6

Every year in England, school children in Reception and Year 6 have their height and weight checked at school as part of the National Child Measurement Programme.
