Panto

We are delighted to have been offered the opportunity to go to the Panto again this year after not attending last year. As the showing is at 10:00am **buses will be leaving school promptly** so please ensure your child is here by **8:45am prompt**. On this day the school gates and doors will be open at 8:30am to avoid congestion outside. If you drop off at school by car, please do so before 8:45am to ensure the road is clear for the coaches arriving at 8:45am.

To keep costs down, PTA funds will be used to provide a packet of crisps for the children at the interval. To reduce plastic waste, we are asking children to take their own water bottle with them.

Upon our return to school, the children will be served their school dinner, this will be a Christmas party lunch school dinner of sandwiches, sausage rolls, vegetable sticks and a biscuit.

This year, we currently have a £1,300 shortfall in contributions for the Pantomime. We now hold this bi-annually in order to try to keep cost to our families to a minimum. However, we will of course review attending this event going forwards. Next year we will revert to an in-house theatrical event, and while we like to provide children with the experience of attending a theatre, we will consult with parents about your preference for 2025 next year as we have to book 12 months in advance.
