## Road Safety Training by the East Riding Council Scooter Training – Year 2

On Monday 11<sup>th</sup> December, Year 2 will be having scooter training. On the morning, please bring your child's scooter to their classroom door, where a member of staff will show you where to leave it. Please collect the scooter from the same place at 3:30pm. Children are **NOT** to ride on their scooter in the school grounds before or after school. If your child has a scooter please ensure it is in a good working condition and has their name clearly displayed on it Children will be given a 15 minute classroom presentation after which instructors will take pupils out on to the playground for 30 minutes of scooter skills training. We recommend a warm, waterproof coat and suitable footwear (laces need to be tied and tucked away).

### Pedestrian Training – Year 4

On Monday 11<sup>th</sup> December, Year 4 children will have their Pedestrian Skills Training given by East Riding Road Safety Officers. Children are given a classroom presentation and then will be taken outside for a valuable practical lesson.
