## School Drop Off/Pick Up

A few parents have asked recently, why can they not wait on the playground in the morning? It is our legal duty to supervise children from 8.45am, this is the time we open the gates.

Prior to Covid, when access was given to the playground before the supervised time, we had numerous incidents and accidents when a number of children were left unattended.

Since operating the current arrangements, we have found that children, when they are dropped off at the school door/going straight to class, enables a much calmer and smoother start to the school day and I know many parents have commented on liking this arrangement.

We open the gates at 8.45am and (8.40am on a wet morning), we appreciate occasionally, a circumstance may delay this by a minute or 2 and thank you for your understanding when this occurs. Can I ask, when your child is near the gates, please do not allow them to climb/swing on the gates, this is to prevent any accidents.

I would like to re-iterate the layby is a drop off/pick up zone only from 8.45am, this is a NO Waiting area.

We pride ourselves on having a good relationship with our neighbours who live on the adjoining roads to school. The residents do get frustrated and complain to school when their driveways are blocked. Therefore, please can I ask you to be respectful to our neighbours, and avoid parking across their driveways and obstructing junctions. I have known residents in the past to report such situations to the police and the local authority and car registration numbers have previously been given! I would not like this to happen to any of our families, so I therefore urge you to park sensibly for the safety of our children, families and community, and of course please use the drop of layby if you can.

I hope this helps to clarify the decisions we take.
