(To avoid confusion, the book you select on the app, will be removed from your child's class reading list, at your convenience please purchase the book from a retailer)

How to consent/sign up for a book -

1. Go to the school app
 2. Select Payments
 3. Choose your book
 4. Tap on consent
 5. Select add to basket
 6. Select view basket
 7. The balance will show zero
 8. Select checkout (**no charge is made to your credit card/account**)
 9. Select OK to complete
 10. At your convenience, purchase your book via a retailer.
 11. If you use a high street retailer you will be able to use the £1 book token which was sent home this week.
 12. Enjoy at home and when finished, please donate to school for everyone to enjoy.
 13. Once you have consented to purchasing the book of your choice, this will be automatically removed from the reading list.
- I would like to express our thanks and gratitude to you in helping us create a wonderful library of books in school.

Instead of or as well as we are asking for donations of cushions/beanbags (if you have one going spare) to enable us to create 'comfy' reading spaces, including developing the cabin into a relaxing reading den for us at playtimes.
