Monday	Reading Comprehension	<p>Read the extract 'The Sweet shop' from 'Boy' (see PDF) and answer the questions.</p> <p>There is a further extract from later in the book called 'The Great Mouse Plot' (See PDF) that you could read if you wish too - it's very funny!</p>
Tuesday	Reasoning and problem solving	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Find the Puzzling Sweet Shop PDF and have a go at the challenges. • You might like to make paper versions of the sweets in the question to help you to work out the answers. Alternatively, you could use different coloured counters, Lego bricks or building blocks as the different types of sweets. • Challenge 1: Can you add another question for someone at home to try? • Challenge 2: Can you create a similar challenge of your own with your own selection of sweets?

Llandaff is part of the city of Cardiff which is in Wales.</p> <p>Can you use your best investigative skills to answer the following questions and create a poster to display your answers?</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Can you find Wales on a map of the UK? Try looking on an online atlas or Google Maps. 2. What is the capital city of Wales? 3. What is the population of Wales? 4. What is the flag of Wales? Can you draw it? What can you find out about the flag? 5. <p>Extra Challenge if desired:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read the extract 'The Great Mouse Plot' (see PDF) and answer the questions if you want to. Or, you might like to write the next part of the story - what do you think happened when Mrs. Pratchett discovered the mouse?! • Try this super-exciting science experiment using Skittles sweets if you have any at home: https://www.science-sparks.com/skittles-experiment/ Remember to use your scientific enquiry skills to predict what you think will happen, make close 		

observations and suggest what the next experiment could be. Could you change the temperature of the water? Or could you try a different kind of liquid? Let us know what you discover!
