Monday	Science	Find out about the life-cycle of a ladybird (Take a look at the PDF below to help you). You can record the different stages of the life-cycle in your own words in your school work book (don't forget to illustrate each stage) or if you have your own idea on how you would like to record the information, go for it!
Tuesday	Maths	Can you tell the time? * Year 1s: O'clock and half past the hour * Year 2s: O'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to You can get your grown up to grab your wall clock and move the hands round for you or if you have a printer you could use the sheets below.
Wednesday	English	Can you retell the story of the Bad-tempered Ladybird? Don't worry about having to write about every animal that the ladybird visits. Instead write a beginning, a middle and an end. Take a look at the template below for ideas on what to include in each section. You can record it in your school work book.
Thursday	Maths	Who does the ladybird meet at each hour? Can you draw the animals in order and label each one with the time that they met? You can record your work in your school work book or you can use the page borders below if you have a printer.

Friday	English	<p>Can you write a book review about 'The Bad-tempered Ladybird'?</p> <p>Take a look at the template below for ideas on what to include in our own review. You can record it in your school book but don't forget to add an illustration of the book cover or the ladybird.</p>

(maybe video call a relative and perform it for them) * Describe the bad-tempered ladybird. What does he look like? How does he act? * Why do you think the ladybird was in a bad mood? * What do ladybirds eat? Can you find out what they like to eat? Draw and label what they eat? * Play ladybird drive (see resource below) * Ladybird craft ideas (see idea below) * Make salt dough ladybirds (see recipe below) * Challenge: Can you find out how many different types of ladybird there are?
